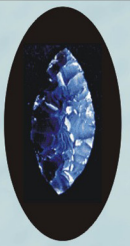




MSc in Environmental and Contextual Archaeology

This is a one year full-time, or two year part-time postgraduate course designed to provide further training to recent graduates in relevant disciplines and professional training for practising archaeologists.

The course seeks to provide an academic and practical training in site observation skills and interpretation, against both environmental and legislative contexts.

One of the main aims of the course, making it unique in the UK, is to examine the contextual relationships between archaeology and the physical environment at various scales, from within-site to wider landscape and regional levels.



The course focuses strongly on the practical aspects of environmental and contextual archaeology, through a range of extensive field and laboratory projects, including a week-long residential programme of investigation of an archaeological site.

Those students following PGDip or MSc pathways will have the opportunity to specialise in different aspects of environmental and contextual archaeology, including the examination of archaeological artefacts, biological remains and the environmental background to ancient and prehistoric human occupation of the landscape.
